FULL STEAM AHEAD

We are gearing up to go full steam ahead, sometimes to places we have never been before. God truly is at the helm of the work He is doing in and through us.

We invite you to come along:

Operation Esperanza, a group of healthcare professionals serving the under resourced in **Ecuador**, travelled in 2023 to provide life-changing hip replacement surgeries. In some cases, they treated patients who had lost hope and others who were immobilized and not able to take care of their families. The smiles on the faces of the patients as they were discharged after surgery were precious to the team who consider their service an act of worship.

The team, led by Dr. Tom Greidanus, celebrated 25 years of service by God's grace.

Our **Gambade Team** are grateful for supporters of the Gambade Medical Clinic. The new staff contingent is in place and are excited to serve the community of Gambade. The clinic is open and serving patients. In the first weeks of opening, they helped patients suffering from cholera and provided the life-saving treatment needed. **The Starfish Project** is a nutrition program that will work with the Clinic to provide nutrition to undernourished children.

The most urgent need now is the clinic's staffing fund. Thank you for your ongoing support of the Gambade Medical Clinic.

Our **Hand in Hand with Haiti Team** continue to support the El Shaddai Community by providing funds for the nutrition program, thereby helping those who had lost their jobs. The Urban Gardening Project produces enough to offset the rising costs of living. In the deteriorating climate of unrest, poverty and kidnappings

for ransom, pray for safety and protection for our partners in Haiti; as the situation is dire and they risk their lives daily for the Kingdom.

China East team are looking for more pediatricians. If you are interested in participating or supporting this effort, please contact the EMAS office.

China South team have been concentrating their efforts in serving with the Cambodia Teams through online teaching of nurses and healthcare students. The team hopes to expand the curriculum they are offering and once again travel for in-person training opportunities. God has been opening doors for service. The second **Cambodia** team was a Medical team exploring how best they can serve going forward. In addition, these teams are looking to send exploratory teams in 2024 into areas they have never gone before. If you are interested in serving with these teams, please contact the office.

The **China West Team** are excited to be exploring new opportunities of service in 2024.

The situation in **Myanmar** has not improved and our team remains vigilant in prayer for our partners in Myanmar, eagerly awaiting when they can travel again.

The **Burkina Faso** Team, with the Sisters of Holy Cross, are working with eMi to plan for the facility on the land God has provided. The Master Plan of the Hospital Campus is ready. The plan includes concept design for water, electricity, and sewer system. EMAS Canada and eMi are coming alongside Sisters "To serve vulnerable women and children in Songdin." The most urgent need is a good supply of water to meet the needs of the campus.

An exploratory trip to **Honduras** by Dr. Robert Clark (former board chair of EMAS Canada) investigated

new areas of service for a dental team. They were well received, and plans are being made to go back in 2024.

Gutu Mission Hospital Project in **Zimbabwe** is ongoing.

After our team of intrepid cyclists raised over 100% of their funds in the **RIDE FOR GUTU MISSION HOPITAL** last year, EMAS Canada served the district of Gutu by hosting a Medical Conference in the fall of 2022 in Masvingo Town. By equipping local healthcare professionals to deal with neonatal and obstetric emergencies, we hope to increase the safety of mothers and their newborns.

This event benefited Gutu district healthcare workers and midwives and gave EMAS Canada a better understanding of the needs in rural Zimbabwe. 70% of the healthcare available to the rural public is through mission's hospitals and church-based organizations.

Another **RIDE FOR GUTU** is planned for September and October of 2023 both in Canada and in Zimbabwe to raise funds for another education conference and equipment needs at Gutu Mission Hospital. You can keep up to date on what our cyclists are planning by visiting our website.

The **Zimbabwe Karanda** team returned from Karanda Hospital in April 2023 after responding to the dental and spiritual needs of the people there. Dr. Ajit Vargis provided dental care and Jeremy Thommy led pastoral care and training to local pastors. The team donated essential dental supplies. If you would like to join the dental team next year, please contact the office.

This year, on their trip to **The Democratic Republic of Congo,** Dr. Philip and Dr. Nancy Wood were joined by Dr. Sharmila Khullar to assist in setting up an improved Histopathology laboratory service. Dr. Sharmila had a year

to prepare and knew that she would have much less equipment than in Montreal, so she was well prepared. Despite Jan 4th being a local holiday, they moved and set up the equipment in the new lab which has better surfaces for cleaning. The tiled floors are also better suited to sanitization. (see photo below)

Dr. Philip and Dr. Nancy spent many hours teaching and mentoring medical student. Our EMAS Canada **DR Congo Scholarship Fund** helps medical students in DR Congo pay their tuition and living expenses. Recently one of the students, **Sarah Alesi Odhipio** (below) was given the award for spiritual and academic excellence by the Faculty

of Medicine, Shalom University, Bunia. She said, "I would like to say a big thank you to EMAS for agreeing to contribute to my training at the

school of medicine. Thanks to your safcrifice, I can realize my dream of becoming a doctor and take care of those in need. God bless you abundantly and may he keep on providing."
