EMAS Canada is in better financial health now than before the pandemic. BUILDING ON A FIRM FOUNDATION

Building on a foundation of over seventy years of service to those in need, EMAS is moving ahead in 2022 to fortify its vision and mission. In the ever-changing landscape of medical missions, our teams are still reaching out to the underserved and equipping local leaders.

Operation Esperanza

The Ecuador team are eager to travel again in January 2023 and serve the people of **Ecuador** by providing life-changing knee and hip replacement surgeries. However, the latest challenge that has emerged is global supply chain issues for the prosthesis needed for the surgeries. Please pray for the resolution of this issue as the team plans their next mission.

Our **Gambade** Team are grateful for supporters of the Gambade Medical Clinic. The pandemic presented many challenges for the team, but especially for the people of Haiti: Covid, earthquakes, floods, and political unrest, but the team have not sat idle. Behind the scenes, they are preparing to hire staff as soon as they can safely travel and work in Haiti.

Meanwhile, clinic construction is complete and the team are sending support for our health agent in Haiti who delivers health education and awareness to people in the surrounding region of Gambade. The Starfish Project is in development, which will work with the Clinic to provide nutrition undernourished to children. The aim is to be ready to hit the ground running and begin staffing and operating the clinic as soon as possible.

While we wait, we wanted you to know that we are thankful for people like you for your ongoing support of the Gambade Medical Clinic.

Our **Hand in Hand with Haiti** Team, continue to support the El Shaddai Community by providing funds for the nutrition program, thereby helping those who had lost their jobs. The Urban Gardening Project produces enough to offset the rising costs of living. Pray for safety and protection for our partners in Haiti.

China East team have a new leader, Dr. J. Tham, who has been transitioning into the role through the mentorship of the previous team leader, Dr. P. Haung. The team's focus is on teaching and providing mental health conferences to equip local healthcare professionals.

China South team have been concentrating their efforts in serving with the Cambodia Team through online teaching of nurses and healthcare students. The team hopes to expand the curriculum they are able to offer. If you are interested in serving with these teams, please contact the office.

In April 2022, the **China West** Team participated in online sharing fueled by their concern for the wellbeing of seniors.

The situation in **Myanmar** has deteriorated considerably. The civil war is intensifying in the state neighboring, our partners', just south of Oaks of Righteousness Garden. The Myanmar Team support a local missionary, to protect their safety, we have avoided specific or sensitive information, but the threat and struggle for survival of the local people is very real. Countless families have been forced to leave their homes to take refuge in the jungle and in internally displaced

people camps. Tragically, the military has also targeted these communities, and lethal threats and injuries are prevalent. Demand for food and medicine is high.

For immediate response, we are raising funds to pay for Emergency Medical Services Training for volunteers. This online training, in the local language and according international guidelines, provides volunteers which are recruited from various not-forprofit organizations through our local connections skills to better provide care. The training covers First Aid & CPR, transportation, emergency care for victims of warfare injuries, and common acute tropical diseases. Each volunteer is in need of a backpack containing essential equipment in order to meet EMS standards.



Reliable Internet access is another major challenge. The whole country is subject to periodic shut downs of electricity and internet service. Printing and distribution of training material is costly.

The Oaks of Righteousness Garden supported by the EMAS Myanmar Team is 70 Acres of sustainable and self-sufficient land, which provides food, refuge, and healthcare for internally displaced people. Your funds help provide basic food, shelter and clothing for these families in dire need.

Recently, three baptisms took place, a joyous testimony of how this ministry in partnership with Hands In Missions are taking care of the spiritual needs of the people too.

The **Burkina Faso** Team, with the Sisters of Holy Cross, are planning

a site visit to Ouagadougou with eMi The long-term aim is to have blueprints in place for the beginning of construction of the first phase of a much-needed medical facility in 2023.

Gutu Mission Hospital Project:

EMAS Canada can best serve the people in the district of Gutu this year by hosting a Medical Conference, which is planned for October 2022 in Masvingo Town.

Our aim is to learn from local healthcare professionals while providing continuing medical education and a retreat. Topics include the role of the mission hospital in rural district health delivery system. This event will benefit Gutu district healthcare workers and midwives and give EMAS Canada a better understanding of the needs in rural Zimbabwe.

Dr. Nancy and Philip Wood had a fruitful trip to Bunia in the **Democratic Republic of Congo** in January, 2022. Dr. Nancy Wood reported that in addition to teaching, 60 hours for Dr. Nancy and 75 hours for Dr. Philip, there was time to spend with 63 individuals to listen to their stories of challenges and blessings and to pray with them.

"An encouragement at the college was that in spite of school and university closures due to the risk of COVID-19 in 2021, there were over 1000 students who were attending classes from January 5th 2022, the beginning of the academic year. However, it was necessary to check in on them all and see that only those who had paid their academic fees could stay! When we left they were almost at 1000."

Our EMAS Canada DR Congo Scholarship Fund helps medical students in DR Congo pay their tuition and living expenses.

On a spiritual level, Dr Nancy said, "No one denies the Christian faith and we pray for them to grow in faith during their 3 - 5 years of studies. The students we support through EMAS are particularly thankful for this opportunity to study and prepare for a career."

Some of our teams are prayerfully seeking wisdom on how they can pivot and best adapt to obstacles and challenges they have faced in the last few years. They are open to new opportunities for service.


